FOUNDING FRIENDSHIP FORCE

- 1977 exchanges began with groups from
 150 400+ Ambassadors on charter flights
- 1980 independent local clubs organized in cities
- 1982 travel arrangements changed from chartered to scheduled airlines – smaller groups club to club
- 1982 Friendship Missions introduced, with day hosting only
- 1992 nominated for Nobel Peace Prize


